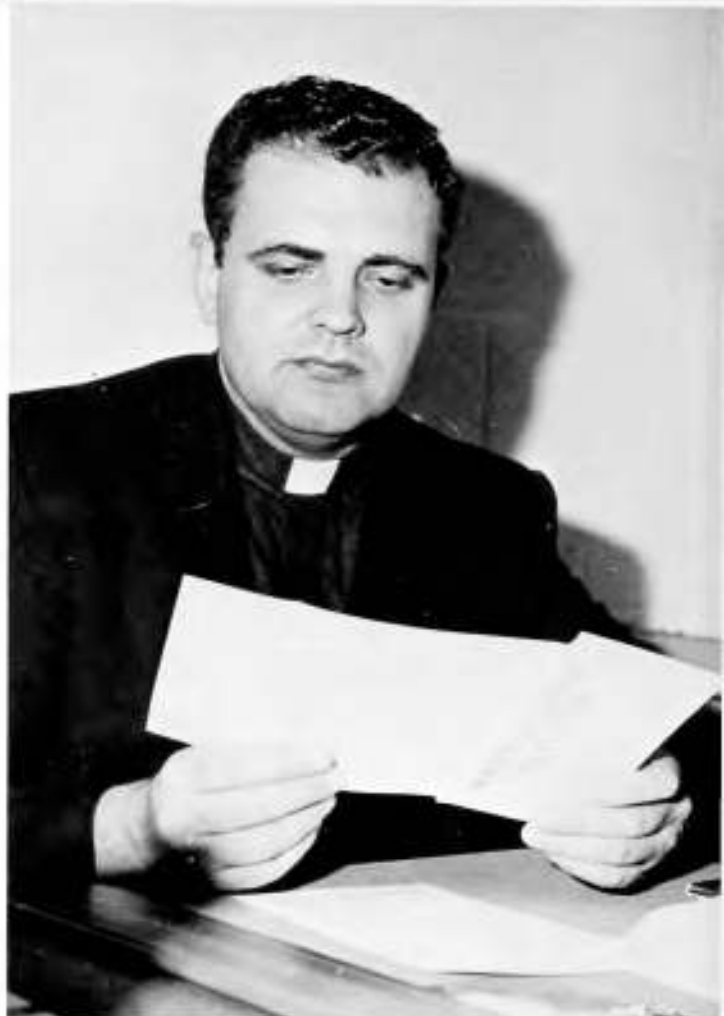

I enjoyed serving as A.S.B. president, and I sincerely hope that the Student Body perseveres in its great spirit and action.

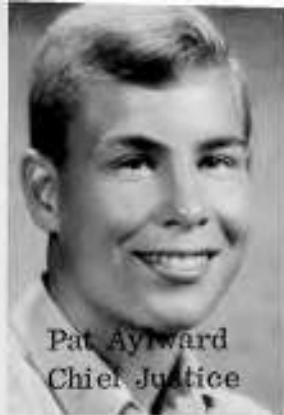

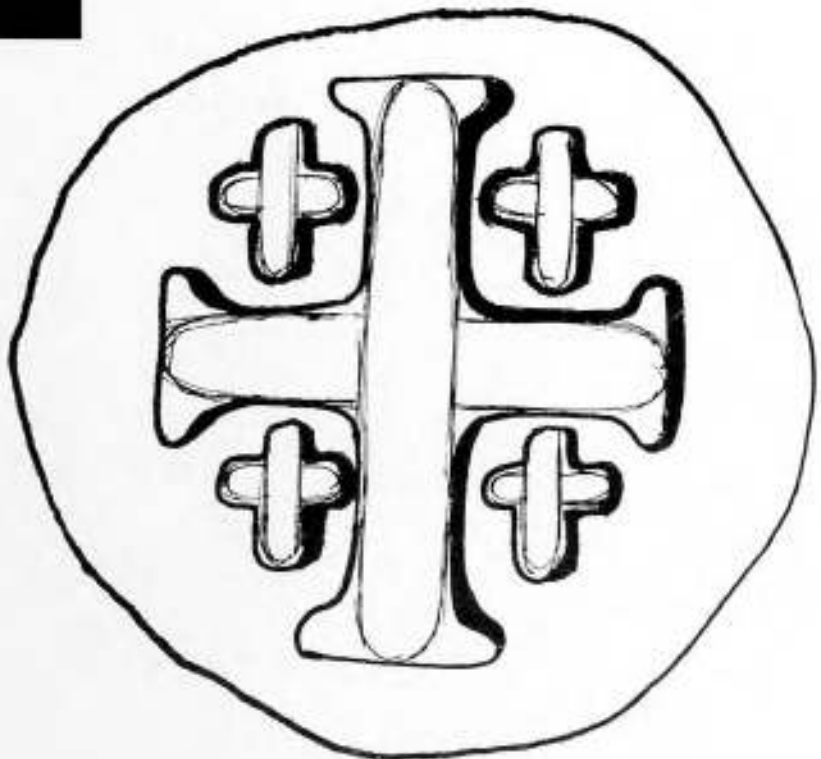

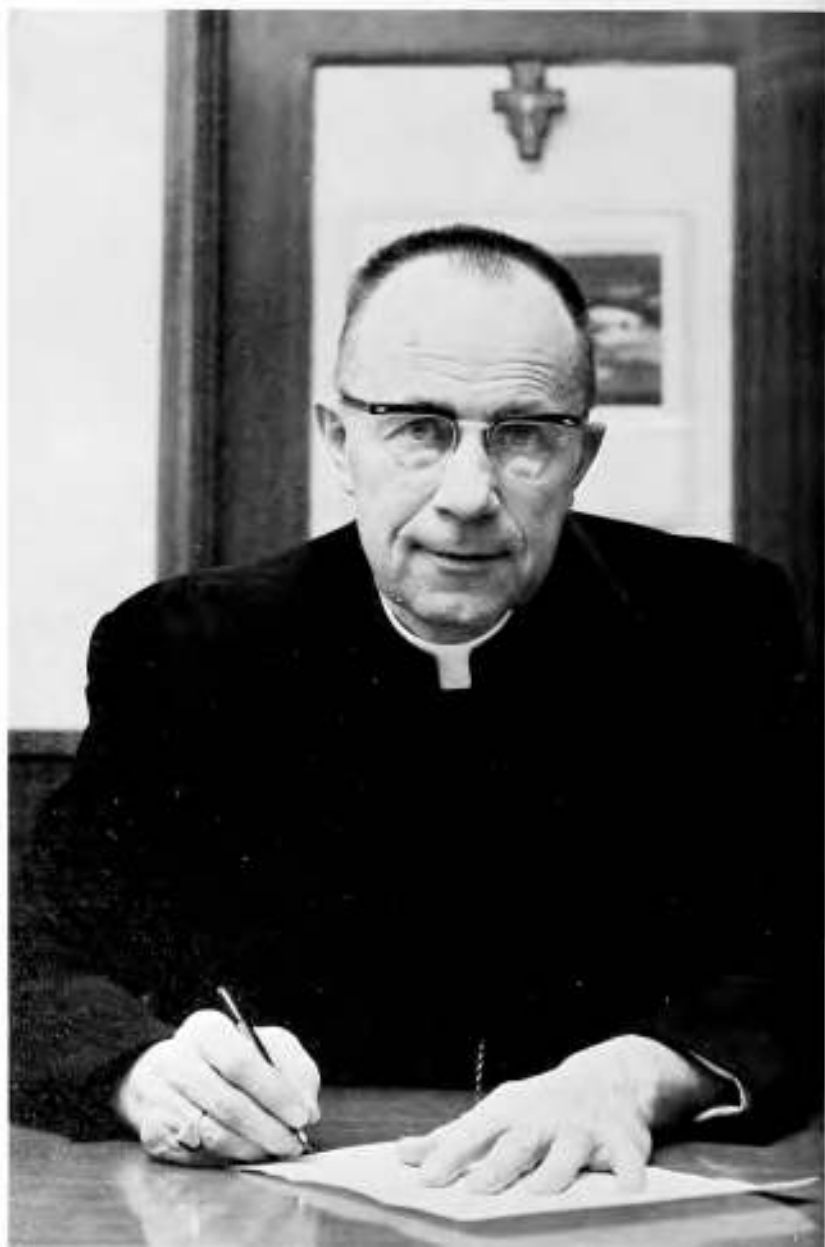




Fr. John O'Dea

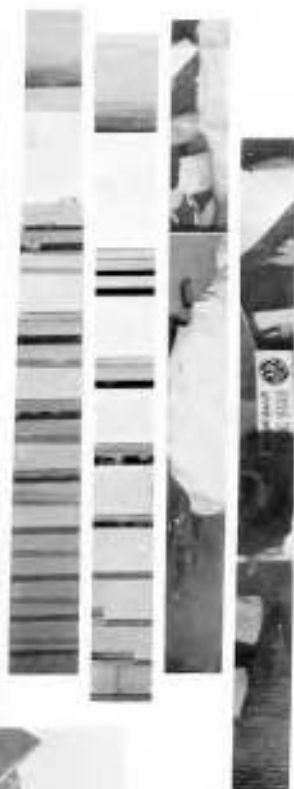
